Derrick Cosenza lifts Tennent as time expires for Hatters Tip-Off title

Bucks County boys basketball roundup: Dec. 8

Derrick Cosenza launched a game-winning shot as time expired to give the William Tennent High School boys basketball team the 66-65 win over Lower Moreland in the Hatters' Basketball Tip-Off Classic Championship match on Saturday. Cosenza's buzzer-beater netted him a game-high 20 points to go along with his 14 rebounds. David West scored 12 points and Josiah Johnson added 10 in the win, while Kip Mooney pulled down eight rebounds and scored eight points.

Bethel Park 60, Holy Ghost Prep 56: Tyler Mish scored 11 points, and Jack Rittenmeyer and Greg Sylvester netted 10 apiece, but the Firebirds came up short in the Bethel Park Tip-Off Tournament championship game. Sean Sylvester contributed six points, as the Firebirds mounted a promising comeback attempt with a 20-point fourth quarter after being down by nine points at the half.

Council Rock North 42, Lansdale Catholic 38: David Mischak and Hunter Wan each scored 10 points to lead the Indians to victory in the Jim Church Classic championship game.

Germantown Academy 63, Souderton 43: Jim Longino exploded for 33 points to lead the Patriots to the win in the Jim Church Classic consolation game. Kyle Anderson scored 15 points and Juan Adames had nine in the victory. Andrew Vince paced the Indians with 10 points.

Amherst Central 56, Central Bucks South 48: Alex Dietz scored 19 points, including four shots from beyond the arc, but the Titans were unable to overtake their New York opponents in the second round of the Suburban One League/Pioneer Athletic Conference Challenge. Ian McCaw added nine points and Mark Kannengieszer scored seven after going 5-6 at the line.

Central Bucks West 53, Spring-Ford 45: The Bucks scored 20 points in the fourth quarter to pull ahead of Spring-Ford after entering the third quarter down by a point. Jack Mulhearn was responsible for more than half of the Bucks' points, scoring 29 points, including seven three-pointers, to secure the win in the second round of the SOL/PAC Challenge. Mika Munari and Jack Neri contributed eight points apiece, while Reed Zerweck had six rebounds and dished out three assists.

Thurgood Marshall 60, Pennsbury 57: The Falcons were just a few points short of the win against a New York team in the Fred Pickett Classic.

Pennridge 67, Audenried 23: The Rams scored 21 points in the first quarter and never looked back on their way to winning the Pennridge Memorial Tip-Off championship game. Sean Yoder led all scorers with 14 points, after going 6-6 at the free throw line, and was among four Rams in double digits. John Dominic netted 11 points and Pat Gillespie and Luke Yoder added 10 apiece.

Faith Christian 59, Harry S. Truman 49: The Lions roared to victory in the Pennridge Memorial Tip-Off third-place game.

George School 53, Princeton Day 51: Onias Outlaw landed a buzzer-beating shot in the fourth quarter to give the Cougars the thrilling victory. Outlaw, who finished with a team-high 16 points, scored the game-winner after taking a long pass from Kenneth Rodriguez. The Cougars were able to gain the final possession when Nazim Pierce forced a Princeton Day turnover with 20 seconds to go. Dwayne Jones contributed 15 points in the win.
