

History: With emphasis on academic research and writing, students develop interpretive and analytical skills while focusing on issues that transcend

national boundaries and encourage truly global citizenship.

Languages: Chinese, French, Latin, and Spanish are offered from introductory to advanced levels and taught for fluency and to help students gain an appreciation for cultures and ideologies different from their own.

Religions: Fostering spiritual development of each individual, courses provide a space of sanctuary amidst the busyness of daily life. Students are exposed to the essentials of a Quaker community and how these are embedded in the culture of George School.
